Cuyahoga Valley Historical Museum is a branch of the Peninsula Library & Historical Society organized for the purpose of interpreting and promoting the area's history through permanent and special exhibits. The Cuyahoga Valley Historical Museum is housed on the second floor of the historic Boston Township Hall which was built in 1887.

Learn about the Moody & Thomas Mill at the Cuyahoga Valley Historical Museum!

Hermon Bronson arrived in Boston Township in 1824. In 1832, he built a flour mill on the narrow strip of land which was part of a peninsula in the Cuyahoga River. Capitalizing on a natural fall in the elevation of the river, the mill went through a few subsequent owners until it was purchased by Chandler Moody and Charles Thomas in 1902. The structure that Bronson had built was taken down and a larger, more efficient mill was built in its place. The Moody & Thomas Milling Company hummed along quite successfully until December 26, 1931. Visit the Cuyahoga Valley Historical Museum and find out what happened on that cold December night.
